Rehospitalization Initiatives

- MI STA*AR (Michigan State Action on Avoidable Re-hospitalizations)
- BOOST-MI
- Public Reporting

MI STA*AR

- MPRO Project
- Pilot Data Collection Underway
 - Two hospitals in Southeast Michigan
 - One hospital in Western Michigan
- Data projected to be shared with hospitals in late May

MI STA*AR Data Collection

- Includes all cases except mental health
- Commercial HMO Health plans only
- Data reported at individual member level and aggregated

MI STA*AR Data Stratification

- Age
 - neonatal (1 month – under 1 year)
 - Pediatric (1 year – under 18)
 - Adult (18 and older)
- Medical Condition
 - Medical
 - Surgical
 - Obstetrics

MI STA*AR Next Steps

- MI STA*AR Pilot hospitals will review their data by June 30
- MPRO seeking funding for further data analyses
- Discussion of roll out plan in mid-July

Project BOOST

- Better Outcomes for Older Adults Through Safe Transitions
- Collaborative of University of Michigan and Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Michigan
- Tool Identification for High Risk patients
- Discharge planning process prior to hospitalization

Project BOOST Time Line

- 17 Physician Organizations expressed interest in January 2010
- BCBSM has provided financial incentives for participating
- Welcome letter and information packet sent to POs in March 2010
- Kick off meeting scheduled for May with POs and mentors

Project BOOST Activities

- Network of Michigan Institutions using the guide and interventions
- Measuring the interventions impact
- Identify implementation factors for adoption and barriers

GDAHC's Role

- GDAHC's mantra
 - *What is GDHAC uniquely qualified to do?*
- GDAHC's Strengths
 - Facilitate collaboration and consensus building among multiple stakeholders representing different sectors and interests
 - Public Reporting of PO and Hospital measures
- What happens when we initiate an endeavor and another organization “takes it?”

Rehospitalization: Who Owns What

- MI STA*AR gives hospitals their data
- Project BOOST gives POs their data
- GDAHC gives the community public reports

Next Steps for GDAHC

- Analyze Health Plan data after MI STA*AR pilot
 - ID hospital level reporting detail (late summer)
 - Report Hospital Rehospitalization rates (fall)
- Partner with project BOOST for PO measures
- Possible reporting levels include:
 - Overall hospital rates
 - Reporting at each stratification level by age, if adequate data
 - PO specific rehospitalization rates
